


ARCHLINEAR DESIGNS By Gavin Grant

Establishing this type of bond acknowledges the behaviors of mediums and reveals a hidden roadmap to create compelling objects. His creative process is a hybrid of spontaneity and design knowledge which involves various learned and self-taught techniques to achieve sinuous and curvilinear movement. Gavin's aim is to continue exploring how his work can permeate public spaces by developing intrinsic invitation with shape and form.
